The 'Rights Respecting School' award (RRSA) will help our children to grow into confident, caring and responsible young citizens both in school and within the wider community. By learning about their rights our children also learn about the importance of respecting the rights of others.

The United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child has 54 articles that apply to all children around the world. Featherstone Nursery School children focus on 8 rights from the 54 articles.
